# Empire 100 Western Art Show Draws Record Crowds & Sales

The 2011 Empire 100 Western Art Show Opening Reception on January 13 was marked by a remarkable showcase of Western art, brisk sales, and a beautiful evening that brought out record crowds. Nearly 400 guests meandered throughout the Northern Trust gallery space, enjoying wine, Western music, hors d'oeuvres, and most importantly, the opportunity to view an outstanding collection of Western art.

A testament to the quality of the show was the small crowd in the lobby of Northern Trust anxiously awaiting the opening of the doors at 4:30pm when sales commenced. Within minutes of opening, ten pieces were sold! Sales continued throughout the evening and by the close, 25 pieces of art sold at a total value of just under \$30,000.

The featured artist was the highly acclaimed artist and sculptor, Bill Moomey. His captivating painting of a pair of bobcats, "Vantage Point," was the winner of the *People's Choice Award*. Santos Barbosa's

"Lowin' Cattle & Dust" won *Best of the Empire*, an award voted by Northern Trust staff for the best work inspired by the Empire Ranch. The remarkable steel sculpture. "Vaquero," by Pat Frederick, won *Honorable Mention*.

"This year's art show was one of the most competitive ever," said Ginger Hambly, chair of the art show. "With more than 500 images submitted, the jury had the demanding task of selecting just 100 pieces for the show."

Ginger thanked Northern Trust for their sponsorship, and Northern Trust staff who put on the elegant reception. Guests continued to converse and gaze at art till the 7pm close. Many guests were clearly delighted to speak to the more than 60 artists who attended the reception. Award-winning singer/songwriter Kip Calahan Young and her husband Dale Young, making up the duet "Forever Young," serenaded throughout the evening.

A portion of each sale benefits the Empire Ranch Foundation's efforts to preserve the Empire Ranch Headquarters, a 22-room 1880s homestead nestled amidst 42,000 acres of the Las Cienegas National (continued on page 2)

Conservation Area in Sonoita, AZ. The Ranch House is listed on the National Register of Historic Places as one of America's Western treasures.

# 2011 Preservation Priorities

In 2011 both the Empire Ranch Foundation and the Bureau of Land Management will focus on two major preservation projects. The BLM has made the rehabilitation of the Adobe Hay Barnits top Empire Ranch priority for available deferred maintenance funds. To ensure that this project meets all Federal guidelines for transparency and competitive bidding, the agency will issue a request for "design-and-build" proposals within the next month. The proposals will include detailed plans to complete structural repairs, so that the Barn will be safe for interpretation and use for a variety of functions. The Adobe Hay Barn was identified as the top priority in the 2009 Seismic and Structural Evaluation completed by Statistical Research, Inc.

The BLM is also moving ahead with development of specifications for a similar contract for the historic Ranch House. As the scope of stabilization work on the structure is much greater, this preliminary step is needed to ensure that the contract for structural work includes all the right elements. But it also means that the process for completing some of the long-awaited

# WATG! Spring & Summer Camps Announced

Wild About the Grasslands! (WATG!), the Empire Ranch Foundation's highly acclaimed experiential ecology and western heritage education program, provides a variety of outdoor adventures and explorations for youth

Cowboy Campout, scheduled for March 15-16 is for teens ages 12-17 who want to experience camping under the stars at Empire Ranch. The Campout will provide a unique opportunity to learn basic camping, Dutch oven cooking, and navigation skills. Activities include a fun-filled evening of cowboy music, wildlife spotting, silly skits & storytelling, and observing the night sky. The next morning after breaking camp, the "wranglers" will hit the trail on a guided nature hike to many scenic and interesting places using their senses, compass, and topographic map. The registration fee per child is \$150 (includes a t-shirt and 3 meals); the optional registration fee for parents is \$75/person.

Nature Heritage Discovery Days, scheduled for June 6-7 is designed for ages 9-14 years. Through guided hikes and explorations these "grasslanders" will discover the Cienega Creek. They will learn about the importance of this precious water source to support a diversity of plants, wildlife, and its significance to the people who depend on it. These youngsters will engage in hands-on activities such as plant and wildlife identification, nature journaling, rope making, building a model of the Cienega Watershed, and using directions and compass to find hidden treasures. The registration fee

per child is \$75 (2-day camp) or \$45 (1-day camp), including a free t-shirt.

Summer Adventure Campout. scheduled for June 10-11 is designed for ages 12-17 years. Through guided expeditions and field study led by local experts these "grasslanders" will discover the forces that shape the landscape of the Las Cienegas NCA. They will explore rare habitats, learn camping and ranching skills, and participate in a service learning project. Campers will engage in activities such as nature journaling, wildlife tracking, macro invertebrate study, adobe brick making, creating nature inspired art, and using Global Positioning System (GPS) devices for both science and treasure hunting. The registration fee per child is \$150. (includes a t-shirt and 3 meals): the optional registration fee for parents is \$75/ person.

structural repairs is underway!

BLM's implementation and funding of these projects allows the Foundation to redirect its own preservation efforts to other buildings and projects. The Board has approved moving forward with work on the Huachuca House. This building, most recently used for housing the BLM Ranger, will be rehabilitated as a Visitor Welcome Center, while also providing the Foundation with storage/office areas. The plan reflects the benefits of "adaptive re-use," a preservation approach that promotes retention of historic look and feel, while making buildings usable for the public, BLM, and our partners.
