Growing Up on the Empire

The Old West came alive at the 7th Annual Roundup Open House at the Empire Ranch Headquarters on Saturday, Oct. 27th. In keeping with this year's theme, "Growing up on the Empire Ranch," youngsters played an important part in the event activities. The main arena featured the colorful Escaramuza y Charros Flor de Primavera and the presentation of colors by the Sonoita Royalty Queen and Little Miss. An expanded Kids' Corral included demonstrations by the Mustang and San Rafael 4-H kids on caring for a variety of livestock. Saguaro Girl Scouts introduced visitors to the new Heritage Discovery Trail that winds alongside the Empire Ranch House and along the Empire Gulch riparian area. Storyteller Glenda Bonin enthralled her audience with "The Stories of Dusty Vail", who grew up on the Empire from 1914 to 1928.

Other arena performers included the skillful Cowboy Mounted Shooters and Kate Ladson demonstrating cow punching and riding skills. Experts in Western ranching showcased a variety of skills including horseshoeing, rawhide, leather and nylon braiding, and reata making. Two well known Western groups "Way Out West" and "The Desert Sons" had crowds toetapping and singing along to great Western favorites. The John Wayne classic Western film, "The Cowboys" was shown in the newly repaired Mechanic's Shop which was transformed into a historic recreation of a Western movie house. Chris Mitchum, who starred in several movies

We've set priorities for 2008's projects. The permanent repair of the lintel, which supports the wall and ceiling above the south entrance into the zaguan, is now critical. Temporary shoring is no longer enough. Repairing it will be a significant contracted project.

The corrals around the ranch house are also in trouble. Weather, use, time and termites have taken their toll. Our volunteers are signing up to help with corral repairs. The costs for this project will be primarily for purchase of historically compatible fencing materials. There are many more projects on our "to do" list, too.

Progress and Plans at the Empire

We hope you've followed our preservation reports throughout the year and noted during your Roundup visit the excellent progress made on numerous historic preservation and public interpretation projects at Empire Ranch. Three contracts were awarded and completed this summer using funds donated ERF members together with BLM cost share grants.

These projects repaired the roof blown off of the Mechanic's Shop, removed old carpet, asbestos tile, and linoleum in the Victorian Addition living and dining rooms and kitchen, and completed Phase 2 repairs to the weakened foundations of the Victorian Addition West Gable wall.

Other major projects, primarily under BLM auspices or with BLM funds, were the installation of a new Heritage Discovery Trail leading visitors through the headquarters down along the Empire Gulch riparian area, a replacement water system, and (at long last) installation of permanent restroom facilities.

Our Volunteer Days have been manned by enthusiastic, tireless, and caring volunteers. They've patched and repaired interior walls and exterior window frames, cleaned up rooms, removed storm debris, helped develop the new Heritage Discovery Trail, and greatly improved the landscape. On the most recent October 20th Volunteer Day, to ready the Ranch Headquarters for the Roundup, over 20 volunteers and several BLM staffers cleaned, pruned, set up arenas, moved hay bales, and encouraged the departure of a skunk who was hiding out in one of the rooms.

A lot has been done—and a lot more is planned for volunteer days in 2008. A major goal this winter will be repair of deteriorated corrals, but there are many more opportunities inside and outdoors at the headquarters. You're invited to c'mon out to the next work day, and lend a hand to ensure the future of Empire Ranch!

Major contracted projects are also planned for 2008. High priority in 2008 is given to contracting for permanent preservation repair and structural reinforcement of our signature (and stressed) wooden lintel at the south entrance to the zaguan passage way. An overall structural and engineering study of the headquarters buildings that will permit ERF and BLM to fully

Empire Ranch Foundation Financial Summary FY06: July 2006 through June 2007

Income, by Source of Funds \$162,489 Total

Outreach Events & Other - 35% (\$57.3K)

BLM Partnership Funds - 23% (\$36.7K)

-Donations - 42% (\$68.5K)

Expenditures, by Use of Funds \$157,444 Total

Outreach & Education - 37% (\$59K)



Income during FY06 totaled \$162,489—42% from donations, 23% in grant funding from our BLM partner, and 35% from outreach events and other sources. Expenditures totaled \$157,444—42% for preservation and adaptive reuse projects, 37% for outreach and education programs, 11% for general administration, and 10% for fundraising.

End-of-year assets totaled \$106.9K, comprising \$18.3K in BLM grant funds (fully obligated); \$5.4K in ERF unrestricted funds obligated for preservation; \$2.9K in ERF restricted funds for repairs; and \$80.2K in ERF unrestricted unobligated funds.
