Your Year-End Support Makes Progress Possible

It's hard to believe 2010 is almost at an end. We've accomplished so much, due to our members' generosity! Over 380 volunteers contributed almost 6,600 hours to our preservation and education efforts. This represents a 12% increase in volunteer hours contributed, and a 70% increase in the number of volunteers from the previous fiscal year.

Last year we asked for your year-end support for seismic and structural repairs to the Adobe Haybarn. As a result of your generous response and that of our partner, the BLM, we will be able to begin work on the Adobe Hay Barn early in 2011. When the project is completed we plan to invite you to an old fashioned Barn Dance!

The 2008 Structural and Seismic Evaluation report which provides the blueprint for repairs to the Adobe Haybarn also delineates essential repairs for the Empire Ranch House, the Hired Man's House, and the Grove House. Please help us to begin to address the needs of these historic structures with a generous year-end contribution!

or the Empire

Our 10th anniversary Empire Ranch Roundup and Open House on October 23rd fittingly celebrated a decade of friend and fundraising for this historic ranch cherished by so many. Our first Roundup was held in September 2000. Its theme, A Heart for the Empire, featured a heart—the first Vail cattle brand for the Empire Ranch.

Each year the Roundup attendance grows and this year the event showcased not only preservation needs but accomplishments, including a permanently repaired lintel over the south Zaguan; new interpretive signage and a display case of items of the era in the Victorian Addition's Master Bedroom, and new trail signs, adobe benches and a hand washing station on the Heritage Discovery Trail.

Approximately 2,000 attended this year's Roundup, fully enjoying the many opportunities to learn about Western history and life. Popular Cowboy Conversations included presentations by Joel Bernstein, Alison Bunting, Jesús Garcia, Susan Vail Hoffman, Dane Johnson, William J. Kelly, Gerald Korte, Gayle Martin, Gil Payette, Robin Pinto, and Bob Shelton (with Don Collier).

Western skills demonstrations included reata making by Dick Schorr, leather carving by Ben Claridge, horsehair rope making by Jesús Garcia, horseshoeing by John Russell, mule packing by Shane Lyman, adobe making by Chris Schrager and David Yubeta, and branding by Bill Schock, Mac Donaldson, Ian Tomlinson and Ron Fish.

Welch, and horse and marksmanship skills by the Cowboy Mounted Shooters and B Troop, 4th U.S. Cavalry (Memorial). The border collie pups of Craig and Carrie Pottinger's CP Ranch in Nogales, AZ provided a delightful and remarkable show of herding expertise.

Visitors were able to speak with more than 20 authors in the Author's Pavilion. The Arizona Historical Society Travelling Docents had adults and children alike guessing the purpose of the items they had on display, and everyone enjoyed photographing re-enactors represented by the Arizona Bounty Hunters, Arizona Ghostriders as well as so many who came dressed for the day. Garret Allen provided a setting for photographs with his wet plate photography.

Touring inside the Ranch House, visitors reviewed new exhibits, and also checked on the status of their bids in three rooms filled with auction items. In the South Barn corrals, Horse'n Around Rescue Ranch and Foundation and Jabez Ranch presented demonstrations on horsemanship skills and caring for neglected horses.

It was especially notable and gratifying to see how many children attended this year's Roundup. Many were drawn to the miniature horses brought by Sherry and Nelson Secor and the "Kid's Corral" organized by the Mustang, Rafael, and Rattlesnake 4H Clubs. Nearby in the North Corral, similar hands on activities were offered by eleven non-profit organizations.

Musical entertainment featured western balladeer Bruce Andre, the Bill Ganz Western Band and Mariachi Apache from Nogales High School. Arbuckles' Coffee Roasters served delicious coffee to all while delectable food choices included barbecue beef 'n fixins, hamburgers, and roasted corn. Many were drawn to the chuck wagon Dutch oven cobbler dessert offered by Empire Ranch board members Tom Rogos and Patty Wands. The Elgin Sonoita Cowbelles graciously served the barbecue lunch, while the Sierra Vista Girl Scouts served the hamburgers, and also assisted in a variety of operational tasks.

Heritage Discovery Trail Enhancements

Delighted Roundup visitors were among the first to experience recently installed enhancements to the 0.5 mile Empire Ranch Heritage Discovery Trail which eventually will circle the entire Empire Ranch Head-quarters. After passing through a new metal gateway, walkers are informed along the way by a series of interpretive signs covering topics such as the history of the Empire Ranch; who lived in the Hired Man's House (HMH); preservation efforts at the HMH; the hidden residents of the Empire Gulch (deer, bobcats, foxes, and javelinas); and the frog refugia.

Other welcome additions to the trail include a hand washing station near the restrooms, and seating constructed of adobe bricks. Plan to enjoy the trail on your next visit to the Empire Ranch—there is so much to learn and see!

New at the Empire Ranch

The Empire Ranch timeline exhibit, first created in 2007, has been updated and completely refurbished by Paul and Sarah Miller. Located in the Living Room of the Victorian Addition, the timeline uses text and photographs to document key historical events from 1876 to the present.

We are also pleased to report our progress on the planned enhancements to the Victorian Addition Master Bedroom and Master Bath. Talented volunteers patched and painted the Master Bedroom during several work sessions this summer, and new curtains now grace the windows. Seven temporary interpretive wall panels, mounted just in time for visitors to the Roundup to enjoy and critique, describe the history of each room.

We are very grateful for the donations received thus far for this project, including paint from Jonathan D. Steffens of Dunn & Edwards Paint Store and vintage bedroom items received from several of our members. These items are on display in the bookcase of the Master Bedroom behind a secure clear panel. Our goal is to have the permanent displays and new light fixtures installed early in 2011.







Financial Summary FY09: July 2009 through June 2010

Income, by Source of Funds \$193,468 Total Expenditures, by Use of Funds \$120,164 Total





Income during FY09 totaled \$193,468 — 36% from member donations, 36% in grant funds from our BLM partner, 2% from a grant from the Fred W. Stang Foundation, and 26% from outreach events and other sources.

Expenditures during FY09 totaled \$120,164 — 24% for preservation and adaptive reuse projects; 46% for outreach and education programs; 16% for fundraising; and 14% for general administration.

End-of-year assets totaled \$163.4K, comprising: \$47.9K in BLM grant funds (fully obligated); \$5.9K in ERF restricted funds for education; \$27.9K in the Vail endowment and ERF restricted funds for repairs; \$21.6K in ERF unrestricted funds obligated for preservation; and \$60.1K in ERF unrestricted unobligated funds.
